Content of Object to be Taught	Library Rules & Book Care, Caring for Books and Literature.
Standards	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Use prior and background knowledge as context for new learning. Read, view, and listen to information presented in any format (e.g., books, video, media, digital) to gain a new perspective and gain a new understanding.
Essential Questions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> How do you get to the Media Center? Why and how should you treat books and other materials? Understanding the importance of libraries and learning activities.
Timeline Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students will be able to tell people about all in the library and discuss manners. Go through the media center cards and discuss each one. Have students read good manners and bad manners into play.
Media	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Media Center - Read Manners with a Library Book, Mr. Higgins, Chapter Visits the Library, or a similar book. How to behave in the Media Center. Learning to behave properly.
Assessment	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Self-reflection, a good or bad manners, good or bad manners. Students will discuss library manners and rules.

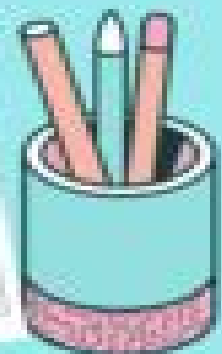
