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web close reading engages with the formal properties of a text its literary devices language structure and style popularized in the mid twentieth century this way of reading allows you to interpret a text without outside information such as historical context author

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web close reading is a reading strategy in which readers focus on specific details and elements such as sentence structure and word choice the process requires strong concentration and is the opposite of skimming a text
