The patient seen today is a 78 year old female presenting with constination for the last month. Marjory's last visit was 12/20/2022, before her husband, Wesley's, death. Her last visit was a medicare visit and no new medications were prescribed and Mrs Buttercup was sent home. Since her last visit, her husband passed away in early January and she explains she has not had the "gumption" to make it back in to see her provider. She is reporting hard, painful bowel movements approximately every three to four days. She is also reporting some insomnia for the past 9 months as well as noticing her eating habits and excercise habits have changed tremendously. She is not eating as much, she describes the meals as "soup and toast" meals and she rarely gets out of the house to exercise anymore. Upon examination, her vitals were all within normal limits, 97.2 F, 82 BPM, 20 respirations per minute, and her blood pressure was 128/74. Her abdomenappears slightly distended and upon auscultation, her bowel sounds were active but decreased. Upon palpation, Mrs. Buttercup winced at deep palpation to the umbilical, left lumber, and left iliac regions of the abdomen, stating the pain upon palpation was about a 4 out of 10 and was a throbbing, dull pain that lingered after palpation. Noted that Mrs. Buttercup was alert and priented x 3, PERRLA, eyes were a bit red, denies complaints of epigastric pain, nausea, vomiting, or gross blood in stool. Patient was unable to ascertain all of the names of her medications for a medication reconciliation but was able to say many of them and explain that she has not adopted any new medications, even over the counter or herbal supplements since her last visit. The provider ordered PRN Ducolax stool softener 10 mg daily and provided discharge instructions with education on constitution. This nurse educated patient on ways to help with potential future constipation like getting exercise. drinking more fluids, eating whole meals and making sure those meals have enough fiber. Mrs. Buttercup verbalized understanding and participated in the talk-back method by telling me how she can try to prevent constipation issues in the future. She denied any questions at this time. An appointment with her primary care provider was made for 10/05/2023 to follow up on the constipation issue. Mrs. Buttercup also took some pamphlets home to read about excercises she can do as well as groups she may be interested in participating in to encourage her to leave the house more often. C.
