Professors explore ghostly history

Ghosts are naturally elusive in their ways for us and transcendence configurations. Some fear their vengeful intentions, others call on them for advice while few can escape their cartoonish appearance in professional discussions leaving their lives.

Loyola professors discussed the ideologies and traditions that have shaped contemporary between the spiritual and earthly realms throughout world history.

Faith James Hug, an associate professor of philosophy, presented to ancient Greek philosophers about the

disembodied soul as a foundation for ghost concepts throughout history.

"There are things to us that are surrounded by metaphysical things, ideas, culture, music, art, knowledge, that kind of stuff," Hugley said. "If there's something to us that's touched by those things, well then that thing wherever it is in, not where it is in the world."

Associate Professor of History Terence Gross-Diaz said contemporary understandings of ghosts are shaped by ancient Greek Roman, Germanic and Celtic beliefs combined with medieval Christian theology.

Loyola hosts protest rights panel

Loyola's Blackboard Analyzing IDEAS hosted the Know Your Rights Panel Student Activism event Oct. 24 in coordination with the university's Center for Diversity and Inclusion. The event sought to give students both the empowerment and knowledge to grow their activism while simultaneously protecting their individual rights as people.

The event was held in Damen Hall 18 South and included four key speakers with different areas of expertise. The first was from outside the Loyola community, Daniel Williams, the director of the Civil Rights Clinic at Ford

Defence Legal Aid. First Defense Legal Aid is a Chicago based organization providing legal services to communities that are over-policed.

From within the Blackboard community was WCLC Rodriguez, dean of students. Healy University is located in the Department of Theology, and Daniel Williams, president of the Student Government of Loyola Chicago.

Blackboard Analyzing IDEAS is an organization within the Center for Diversity and Inclusion that serves to give students the resources to engage in activism. Healy University is an organization consists of student leaders, called Ideators, who help coordinate workshops and events to foster empowerment and development for

activating and continuing activists.

Williams began the informational session of the event by giving a presentation on WCLC, highlighting their mission and providing information on the responsibilities of such boards of students. He also discussed the importance of student voices, not just within WCLC, but ensuring the broader student body population knows WCLC is a valuable resource to turn to when they have concerns.

"We are always looking for ways to continue growing the media of students," Williams said. "We always encourage students to come to us and work with us. We do our best to be accessible to the student body."

The event then moved into the panel portion where students were encouraged to ask questions about their rights as activists, specifically within the lines of Loyola policies. All of the panelists were able to answer the questions.

The conversations focused heavily on the changes to policies within the Community Standards Handbook that went into effect this year. The changes introduced restrictions on how students can protest. The panelists expressed how they plan to use the First Quad and within the halls of 18 to 19.

Healy University provided legal advice on how to protect protesting as students could better understand what rights they have, and to what extent they're applicable to certain situations — specifically the First Amendment as it applies to freedom of speech and assembly.

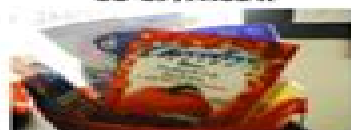
local vendors adorned each corner of the city as staff placed a tent outside the entrance for children to color miniature pumpkins.
