

Grammar Guide

Punctuation Rules

- A period is used....
 - at the end of declarative sentences and mild imperatives.
 - after initials and abbreviations.
 - only once for a sentence ending with an abbreviation.
- A question mark is used....
 - at the end of an interrogative sentence.
- An exclamation mark is used....
 - after a word, phrase, or sentence showing strong feeling.
- A comma is used....
 - to separate two or more adjectives of equal rank.
 - to set off a direct quotation.
 - to separate three or more words, phrases, or clauses in a series.
 - to separate two independent clauses in a compound sentence.
 - to set off a word, phrase, or dependent clause at the beginning of a sentence.
- A semicolon is used....
 - to separate independent clauses very close in meaning but not separated by *and*, *but*, *or*, *nor*, *for*, or *yet*.
 - to separate items in a series when the series already contains commas.
- A colon is used....
 - before a list of items or details.
 - before a statement that summarizes the original statement.
 - before a long, formal quotation or statement.
- Parentheses are used....
 - to set off words, phrases, clauses, or sentences which are independent of the main part of the sentence.
- Quotation marks are used....
 - to set off a direct quotation. (Single quotation marks are used for quotes within quotes.)
 - to set off words, phrases, or sentences referred to in the sentence.
 - to set off slang and foreign words or phrases.

Pronoun-Antecedent Agreement

- A personal pronoun must agree with its antecedent in person, number, and gender.
- Collective nouns are singular when the group is acting as a single unit.
- Collective nouns are plural when the members of the group are acting independently.
Example:
The orchestra disagree on the selections for the concert.

Subject-Verb Agreement

- Normally, when two or more subjects are connected by *and*, the subject is plural and requires a plural verb.
Fred and Dave like this class.
- If the two subjects form a unit, the subject is then singular and requires a singular verb.
Chicken and dumplings is my favorite meal.
- Two singular subjects joined by *or* are considered singular and require a singular verb.
- When one of the subjects is singular and the other is plural, the verb agrees with the subject that is nearest.
- The subject of the sentence is never affected by intervening phrases that might come between it and the verb.
- A collective noun that is singular requires a singular verb.
- If the collective noun indicates by its usage that the individual members are acting separately, then a plural verb is required.
- A plural noun that shows weight, extent, or quantity is singular and takes a singular verb.

Rules for Titles

- All principal words in titles are capitalized. Do not capitalize prepositions, coordinating conjunctions, and articles unless they begin the title.
- Underline the titles of books, magazines, newspapers, and films. (Titles may take the place of underlining if you are using a word processor capable of doing it.)
- Quotation marks are used to enclose the titles of magazine articles, chapters of books, names of songs, and titles of poems.

Capitalization Rules

- Capitalize names of particular persons, places, and things.
- Capitalize titles of rank when they come before a person's name.
- Do not capitalize the names of the seasons of the year unless they are personified.
- The words *north*, *south*, *east*, and *west* are capitalized only when they refer to sections of the country, not directions.
- The names of school subjects are not capitalized unless they are names of languages.
- All words that refer to a specific deity and sacred books are capitalized.

The "Of" Error

- Do not substitute the preposition *of* for the auxiliary verb *have*. Common error forms are:
could of
should of

could have
should have

Grammars, Grammarians and Grammar-Writing in Eighteenth-Century England Ingrid Tieken-Boon van Ostade, 2008-08-27 The book offers insight into the publication history of eighteenth century English grammars in unprecedented detail It is based on a close analysis of various types of relevant information Alston s bibliography of 1965 showing that this source needs to be revised urgently the recently published online database Eighteenth Century Collections Online ECCO with respect to sources of information never previously explored or analysed such as book catalogues and library catalogues Carol Percy s database on the reception of eighteenth century grammars in contemporary periodical reviews and so called precept corpora containing data on the treatment in a large variety of grammars and other works of individual grammatical constructions By focussing on individual grammars and their history a number of long standing questions are solved with respect to the authorship of particular grammars and related work the Brightland Gildon grammar and the Bellum Grammaticale Ann Fisher s grammar while new questions are identified such as the significant change of approach between the publication of one grammar and its second edition of seven years later Priestley and the dependence of later practical grammars for mothers and their children on earlier publications The contributions present a view of the grammarians as individuals with or without specific qualifications for undertaking what they did with their own ideas on teaching methodology and as writers ultimately engaged in the common aim presenting practical grammars of English to the general public Interestingly and importantly this collection of articles demonstrates the potential of ECCO as a resource for further research in the field

Diarmuid Lynch Eileen McGough, 2013-05-20 On Saturday night 22 April 1916 a tense meeting in Dublin went on into the small hours to decide whether or not the Easter Rising would go ahead Present at that meeting were P draig Pearse Tom s MacDonagh Joseph Plunkett and Se n MacDiarmada The fifth man present at the all night session Diarmuid Lynch was the only one still alive a month later It is difficult to understand how Lynch a member of the Supreme Council of the IRB has been forgotten so completely Lynch was at the heart of plans for the Rising and was aide de camp to James Connolly in the GPO Initially sentenced to death his sentence was commuted to ten years penal servitude because he was an American citizen However he was released on 16 June 1917 Immediately following his release Lynch became active again and along with Michael Collins and Thomas Ashe participated in the reorganisation of

the IRB After the 1917 Sinn F in Ard Fheis Lynch like Collins held three senior posts in the IRB Sinn F in and in the Irish Volunteers He was again arrested and deported to America in 1918 Lynch was elected although still in the US as a TD for the constituency of Cork South East in the 1918 elections In America he was working frenetically as the national secretary of the FOIF Friends of Irish Freedom organisation but later sharp differences arose between De Valera and the FOIF about how funds raised in America should be spent Lynch did not take part in the Civil War but made several unsuccessful attempts to stop it
